## **6<sup>th</sup> Annual National Domestic Violence Apprehension Detail Local Results**

**IMPORTANT: In an effort to keep wanted persons from being tipped off about the apprehension detail, we would like you to not disseminate this information until 10:00 p.m. on Thursday, October 16<sup>th</sup>.**

On 10/16/08, the Shasta County District Attorney's Office and members of the Shasta County Sheriff's Office, Shasta County Probation Department, Redding Police Department, Anderson Police Department, Marshall's Office, California Highway Patrol, and the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, Division of Adult Parole Operations, Redding Parole Unit, jointly participated in a nationwide warrant sweep to arrest domestic violence offenders. The event is part of the domestic violence awareness month activities in Shasta County.

The nationwide event is called the National Family Violence Apprehension Detail. This is the 6<sup>th</sup> annual warrant sweep all of which have been coordinated by the Clackamas County Sheriff's Office Domestic Violence Enhanced Response Team (DVERT) in Clackamas County, Oregon. Nationwide, last year 7,682 warrant services were attempted and 1,780 arrest warrants were served during the one day operation. In 2007, Shasta County was one of four California counties joining in the national effort.

This year's Shasta County effort involved 37 law enforcement, probation, and parole officers throughout the county arresting defendants with outstanding arrest warrants for domestic violence offenses. The warrants served consisted of felony and misdemeanor cases.

Law enforcement officials arrested 14 subjects locally and were able to locate 2 other suspects out of the county and had those warrants served as well. One of the suspects arrested on a felony warrant was also found to be in possession of approximately 1 ½ pounds of marijuana. A misdemeanor warrant suspect attempted to smuggle a small amount of methamphetamine into the jail after her arrest. Both suspects are now facing additional charges.

On Friday, October 17<sup>th</sup>, Clackamas County Sheriff's Office DVERT will make available the final results of the national apprehension detail.
