Redding Man Sentenced to Ten Years State Prison

Justin Brian Fischbach, 31, of Redding, was sentenced today to ten years in state prison for multiple felonies including domestic violence, assault on a peace officer, and possession of narcotics.

On March 15, 2011, Fischbach was pulled over for expired registration and was found to be in possession of hydrocodone. He pled to the possession of a controlled substance. This case was investigated by Officer Day from the Anderson Police Department.

On August 11, 2011, Fischbach entered a gas station and punched and kicked a man because he was there with Fischbach's ex-girlfriend. He pled to a battery with serious bodily injury from that incident which was investigated by Officer McGinnis of the Redding Police Department.

On November 27, 2011, Fischbach was pulled over for speeding and was found to be in possession of numerous narcotics as well as a .45 caliber handgun. He pled to transportation of methamphetamine and felon in possession of a firearm. This case was investigated by Detective Jackson from the Shasta County Sheriff's Department.

On January 16, 2012, Fischbach strangled and battered a woman. The next day he returned and threatened to kill her. He pled to a felony domestic battery

with injury. This case was investigated by Officer Tumelson of the Redding Police Department.

On February 5, 2012, Fischbach led officers on a high speed chase from Knighton Rd. and Churn Creek Rd in Redding to Anderson. Fischbach turned from Hawes Rd. to Hopson Rd. and encountered a dead end. He put his car in reverse, striking an officer's patrol vehicle. Fischbach pled to assault on a peace officer and felony evading a peace officer. This case was investigated by Deputy Fleming of the Shasta County Sheriff's Department.

This is Fischbach's second time being sentenced to state prison. He was originally sent to prison for narcotics convictions in 2005.
