DANIEL HANNAH CONVICTED OF RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES

Today, a Shasta County jury found Daniel Hannah, 31, of Redding, guilty of four felony counts in connection with two June 2011 residential burglaries in the City of Redding and Shingletown.

Evidence presented at trial showed that on June 14, 2011, Hannah attempted to burglarize a home on Howard Drive in Redding by entering through a back yard sliding glass door. The occupant, who was home at the time, called 911, and Hannah fled. Thanks to the quick response of the Redding Police Department, Hannah was apprehended and arrested just down the street. He was released from jail the same day.

Hannah was also convicted of burglary and other crimes in connection with a burglary in Shingletown which occurred between June 15 and June 19, 2011. In that burglary, Hannah participated in the theft of well over \$100,000 worth of property. Much of the property was found in Hannah's possession when he was arrested by sheriff's detectives on June 30, 2011. He has remained in custody in the Shasta County Jail since that date.

Hannah was convicted of attempted first degree burglary in connection with the Redding case. He was also convicted of first degree burglary, second degree burglary, and grand theft of firearms for the crimes in Shingletown. The jury also found true sentencing enhancements alleging that the amount of property stolen in the burglary exceeded \$100,000 in value. Earlier in the trial, Hannah pled no contest to the crime of being a felon in possession of ammunition. This offense arose out of ammunition found in his possession by law enforcement when he was arrested.

Three of the crimes of which Hannah was convicted are considered "strikes" under California's Three Strikes Law. Hannah who remains in custody with bail set at \$300,000 faces a potential total prison sentence of fourteen years at his sentencing, scheduled for July 20, 2012, before the Honorable Cara Beatty.

The case was prosecuted by Senior Deputy District Attorney Benjamin Hanna and investigated by Detective Mark Haslam of the Shasta County Sheriff's Office. Officers James Cumming and Rebecca Zufall investigated the Redding Police Department case. The victims were assisted throughout the court process by Victim Assistance Advocate Candice Biddle. .
