SERIAL BURGLAR ACCEPTS 25 YEARS IN STATE PRISON

Today, Jeremy James Binion, 33, of Redding pleaded guilty to four residential burglaries and admitted a prior serious felony and strike enhancement in exchange for 25 years in state prison. Binion was charged with eight residential burglaries, an attempted residential burglary, and being a felon in possession of a firearm. Binion is set to be sentenced on August 15, 2013 in Department 2.

The charges stem from a string of burglaries that occurred in the City of Redding and Shasta County during the month of February, 2012. During some of the burglaries, Binion and two females, Cinthia Willis and Donna Taylor, would knock on the door to determine if someone was home and then Binion would kick in the door after determining no one was home. They primarily stole jewelry, money, electronics, and other more valuable items. Taylor then sold portions of the jewelry to a local jewelry exchange businesses in Redding. A quantity of that property was recovered for the victims.

The case was investigated by the Redding Police Department Detective Ron Icely, Shasta County Sheriff's Office Detective Nick Thompson, and was prosecuted by Deputy District Attorney Emily Mees.
