Man Faces Life After Jury Finds Him Guilty of Arson

Today, a Shasta County jury found Daniel F. Page guilty of arson of an inhabited structure and guilty of residential burglary. After finding two prior strike allegations true, the court set a judgment and sentencing date for December 9, 2013. Mr. Page faces a potential sentence of thirty-one years to life in prison.

On July 20, 2012, Mr. Page's wife left her apartment in Redding and took her kids to Weed, California to visit her parents. On July 21, 2012 Mr. Page's wife served him with a restraining order. Just after midnight on the morning of July 22, 2012, Mr. Page engaged in a physical altercation with his wife at the Ten Pin Bar in Weed. After punching his wife and knocking her unconscious, Mr. Page fled the bar. Approximately three hours later, Mr. Page travelled from Weed to Redding to his wife's apartment. Once at the apartment, Mr. Page entered through a window, and set the place on fire.

Members of the Redding Fire Department arrived on scene and extinguished the fire. Inspector Craig Wittner of the Redding Fire Department conducted the arson investigation that led to Mr. Page's arrest. William Bateman prosecuted the case for the Office the Shasta County District Attorney.
