NOTICE OF INTENT TO APPROVE ADMINISTRATIVE PERMITS**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Shasta County Planning Director has determined that the proposed uses meet all applicable criteria and on **Tuesday, October 4, 2016**, intends to approve the following Administrative Permit:

**Administrative Permit 16-045.** The project site is located in the Oak Run area on a 5-acre parcel on Oak Run Road about 500 feet south west of the intersection of Oak Run Road and Teri-Rand Lane (10977 Oak Run Road). **Chris Mesker** has requested approval for a proposed 25-foot wide, by 25-foot 8-inch long, by 17-foot high guest house to be located 34 feet from the western property line, a proposed 30-foot wide by 40-foot long by 15-foot high gazebo to be located 68 feet from the eastern property line, a proposed 34-foot wide by 44-foot long by 24-foot high barn to be located 80 feet from the western property line, and a proposed 34-foot wide by 44-foot long by 24-foot high shop to be located 50 feet from the western property line. The property is currently developed with a single-family residence and an attached garage. Staff Planner: Price.

All interested parties are encouraged to comment on the merits of the project to be authorized by the permit and may submit comments up to 5:00 p.m., Monday, October 3, 2016, at the department address noted above. Persons wishing to submit comments are encouraged to first contact the staff planner listed for each project.

The Planning Director is authorized to approve Administrative Permits without a public hearing. Appeals must be submitted in writing to the Department of Resource Management, Planning Division, within five calendar days of the permit approval date stated above. Appeals are subject to processing fees. Please note that any challenge of the proposed action in court may be limited to only those issues raised during the public comment period described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the Planning Director on, or prior to, the approval date.
