Comment on Climate Action Plan (EIR) for Shasta County(Global Warming)

Dear Mr. Fieseler,

I am so pleased with the timing of this E.I.R.

Global warming proves that the impact of a major pollution source is not only county wide, but global.

In the past, local agencies have only considered the impacts of heavy industry, such as Knauf Fiberglass to the immediate area surrounding the project.

This E.I.R. Is the perfect opportunity for you and your agency to consider the cumulative impacts of the proposed 3M Corporation Quarry and the new proposed factory at Sierra Pacific in Anderson. The 3M Quarry is proposing *four* factories that each have enough toxic emissions to require pollution permits.

Sierra Pacific is trying to amend their old PSD permit to include their new construction. I compare this to having a permit to build a two bedroom house. After it is built, you ask for that permit to be amended to also allow you to now build a five bedroom house. The argument being it is on the same property.

Shasta County is already consistently out of compliance with state air quality standards. How will your agency consider the cumulative quantities of the individual hazardous elements (Nox for example) being released by all hazardous emitting factories impact on the county? I have kept my question to one to give you time for a comprehensive answer.
