PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT

April 1, 2016

As a reminder to the public of Shasta County would you please announce:

The second installment of secured property tax for fiscal year 2015-2016 will become delinquent at 5:00 p.m., Monday, the 11th of April. NOTE: If such time of delinquency falls on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, the time of delinquency is 5:00 p.m. on the next business day. After the above date a delinquent penalty of 10% plus an additional \$10.00 will be added to all unpaid tax bills.

Although the taxes may be paid in two installments, there is only one tax bill mailed each year. This year's bills were mailed last October and **property owners who did not receive a bill or who have not determined the amount of tax due on their property should do so at once by calling the Tax Collector's office. Failure to receive a bill does not affect imposition of penalties.**

The Tax Collector's office, located in Room 227 of the County Administrative Building, is open from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, and our telephone number is (530) 225-5511. The taxes may be paid at the Tax Collector's office or mailed to that office at P.O. Box 991830, Redding, CA 96099-1830. Online payments can be made with Credit/Debit Card or E-Check. Telephone payments can be made by calling 844-382-4430 or 800-487-4567. The company we use to process electronic payments will add a convenience fee to your bill. Our office does not accept credit or debit cards at the counter. When paying the taxes in person, the public can expect moderate to, at times, substantial delays. This is primarily due to the numerous inquiries we are receiving as the delinquent date approaches. **Those mailing their payments should do so early in order to assure a postmark that is April 11th or earlier.** In order to assure proper credit for mailed payments, be sure to enclose the payment stub portion of the tax bill or at the very least, the Assessor's parcel number of the property.

Your cooperation in getting this announcement to the public will be greatly appreciated.
