Q. <u>HAZARDOUS MATERIAL BUSINESS PLANS</u>	

Fees are paid on an annual basis for submittal of business plans and/or inventories for hazardous and acutely hazardous materials in reportable quantities as prescribed by Chapter 6.95 of the California Health and Safety Code.

For the purposes of fee payment, quantities are determined by the maximum aggregate amount of reportable hazardous materials, acutely hazardous materials or mixture containing a hazardous material or acutely hazardous material stored at any one time during the reporting year.

Inventoried Hazardous Material

Includes only hazardous, acutely hazardous, or mixture of a hazardous material in reportable quantities as follows:

1. Equal to or greater than 500 lbs./solid
2. Equal to or greater than 55 gal./liquid
3. Equal to or greater than 200 cu. ft./compressed gas at Standard Temperature and Pressure (STP)

Hazardous materials are those as defined in Chapter 6.95 of the State Health and Safety Code.

Acutely Hazardous

Any business facility that stores reportable quantities of any acutely hazardous material as defined by Section 25532 of the Health and Safety Code shall pay an additional fee equal to 50% of the base fee for that business facility.

Range 1

Base fee - \$73.98

This range only applies to those business facilities that store hazardous materials in underground tanks currently permitted by the Shasta County Environmental Health Division. If this same facility stores any aboveground hazardous material in reportable quantities, other than for propane retail sales, Range 2,3,4, or 5 apply. Facilities which store 10,000 or more pounds of propane - range 4 or 5 applies.

Exception: Facilities which remove underground storage tanks but continue propane sales (less than 10,000 pounds storage at a time) shall remain in this fee range. This exception would no longer apply at such time as the facility again handles other hazardous materials at or above reportable amounts or 10,000 or more pounds of propane.

Range 5

Base fee - \$1,479.38 + \$7.38 /inventoried hazardous material at reportable quantity

15,001+ cu.ft./compressed gas at STP

Exception to Range 5 only:

1. Businesses that have only aboveground storage of gasoline or diesel for immediate retail sale shall pay 50% of the base fee as their total fee.
2. Businesses that store diesel for in-house fleet fueling operations shall for purposes of fee payment count only the first 5,000 gallons of diesel in addition to other stored hazardous materials.

Cal ARP Facilities - facilities required to submit a Risk Management Plan (RMP) shall pay for staff time and costs in reviewing and evaluating the RMP and review of public comment after the first 10 hours at a rate of \$66.58 /hr
