LAW LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Governs the Shasta County Law Library. Qualifications: The judges of the Superior Court elect either four or five of their number to serve as trustees. Any judge of the Superior Court who is an ex officio or elected member may designate a resident of the county or a member of the State Bar to act for the judge as trustee. The Chair of the Board of Supervisors is an ex officio trustee; but the Board of Supervisors, at the request of the Chair, may appoint a member of the State Bar, any other member of the Board of Supervisors, or a resident of the county to serve as trustee in place of the Chair. The appointment of the person selected in place of the chair of the Board of Supervisors shall expire when a new Chair of the Board of Supervisors is selected, and that appointment shall not be subject to the provisions of Section 6302. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint as many additional trustees, who are members of the State Bar, as may be necessary to constitute a board of at least six and not more than seven members. No more than two law library trustees may be residents of the county who are not judges of the county, members of the State Bar, or members of the Board of Supervisors of the county.

LOCAL CHILD AND DEVELOPMENT PLANNING COUNCIL

Provides child care and development services for low-income families, documents results of the needs assessment date for child care, encourages public input regarding local priorities, prepares a county wide plan regarding child care options, conducts periodic reviews of child care programs funded through the state and county, and consolidates local child care waiting lists. Qualifications: 20% of the membership shall be consumers; 20% shall be child care providers, reflective of the range of child care providers in the county; 20% shall be public agency representatives; 20% shall be community representatives, who shall not be child care providers or agencies that contract with the department to provide child care and development services; and the remaining 20% shall be appointed at the discretion of the appointing agencies.

Western Shasta Resource Conservation District works with willing landowners, government agencies and other organizations to facilitate the conservation and restoration of Western Shasta County's natural resources. The District currently assists landowners with technical assistance and also implements projects for Erosion Control, Fuels Management, Watershed Restoration, Watershed Group Formation, Fisheries Restoration, and Natural Resource Education. Qualifications: The Western Shasta Resource Conservation District is governed by a 7-member volunteer Board of Directors with the support of two associate directors, all local landowners and business people, appointed by the Shasta County Board of Supervisors. The board membership reflects a broad knowledge about conservation, along with a respect for agriculture, forestry, mining, and other endeavors that use natural resources.
