MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The Board received a presentation from Sheriff Johnson to acknowledge and show appreciation for Sheriff's Office Volunteers. These groups include chaplains, citizen's patrol, search & rescue, mounted posse, dive posse, jeep posse, search dogs, mountain rescue, man-trackers, flying posse, explorers and reserve deputy. The Board held a discussion regarding the Redding Rancheria's efforts to relocate Win-River Casino. This included presentations from the Rancheria, Shasta County Residents for Positive Community Development, and comments from the public. Ultimately, the Board directed staff to prepare a letter for Board approval that withdraws a previous letter of opposition to the project, and expresses general support for the project.

The Board adopted a resolution defining property tax exchange terms resulting from Shasta Community Service District's (CSD) request to transfer fire services from the CSD to County Fire.

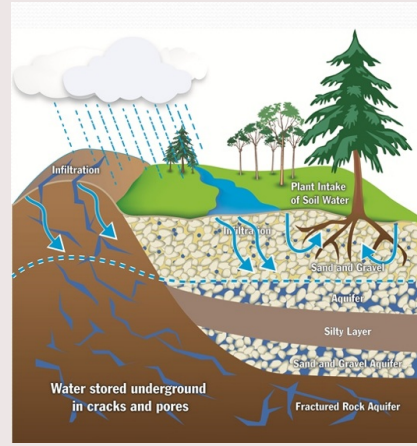


The Board unanimously voted to amend a county policy to allow the public to use the overhead projector to display images while providing public comment.

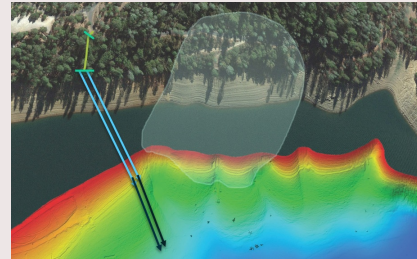


The Board received a presentation from Sheriff's Office staff regarding a draft military equipment use policy that is being worked on in accordance with Assembly Bill 481. A public workshop will be held on May 6 at 10am at the Larry J Farr Community Center located at 4499 Main Street in the City of Shasta Lake to discuss the impact of this Assembly Bill on the community. Sheriff's staff will return at a later date with developments.

The Board received a presentation from Public Works Director Pat Minturn regarding drought conditions in Shasta County. The Board also adopted a resolution to continue a local drought emergency proclamation. Watch Director Minturn's presentation [here](#).



The Board adopted a resolution that finds an emergency exists in County Service Area 6 (Jones Valley Area). This resolution will expedite the process to modify pumps that bring water from the lake for use by the District. Work on this project is expected to begin in the next couple months.
