

VII. Presentations	<p>A. <u>FENTANYL: THE LATEST OPIOID TREND:</u> A PowerPoint on Fentanyl in Shasta County was presented by Amy Koslosky, HHS Community Education Specialist and Rene Saldana, HHS Epidemiologist. Fentanyl, a powerful synthetic opioid, was introduced into the illicit drug supply in 2013-14. A salt-sized grain of fentanyl can be fatal. RPD reported daily fentanyl-related calls and overdoses and projects 15 or more deaths due to fentanyl by the end of 2021. Because fentanyl is often an invisible filler in street and recreational drugs, the danger of accidental overdose affects a wide variety of age groups and demographics. Testing strips can be purchased to screen substances for fentanyl content. 	<p>members and guests in a discussion on the efficacy of various fentanyl education campaigns.</p> <p>B. <u>JUVENILE REHABILITATION FACILITY AND RIVERS EDGE ACADEMY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES:</u> A presentation on youth programs was provided by Miguel Rodriguez, Children’s Services Branch Director. The Juvenile Rehabilitation Facility (JRF), employs a Mental Health Clinician 40 hours a week from 2-10 p.m., providing support during the most vulnerable hours for juveniles and avoiding the disruption of school schedules. A Psychiatrist will join the JRF staff while also providing outpatient services, offering a continuum of care for youth transitioning out of the JRF. Branch Director Rodriguez explained that the broad majority of JRF clients have a history of trauma contributing to behavioral and mental health disorders. The program has expanded its focus to work with families. Branch Director Greene adds the California Youth Authority is in its last month of operation. Juveniles who are tried and convicted will now be diverted to County facilities such as the JRF. In response, Children’s Services is working to incorporate a variety of levels of care, drastically increase the total hours of mental health services available, increase safety measures, and reduce recidivism.</p>		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Miguel Rodriguez, Children’s Services Branch Director
