## CURRENT SITUATION

### Situation Summary:

- We have no new positive cases today.
- All of us here at Unified Command would like to thank businesses who have taken proactive measures to help keep our community healthy and help prevent the spread of COVID-19 while we are still under the governor's stay-at-home order. Some of the safe business practices seen locally include:
  - Protective shield between cashiers and customers.
  - Floor indicators to ensure social distancing for customers in checkout lines.
  - Sanitizing debit/credit card machines between customers.
  - Supplying customers with hand sanitizer and sanitizing carts between customer uses.
  - Requiring face coverings for customers and staff by businesses that may be too small to allow for social distance at all times.
  - Limiting the number of customers in the store to allow customers and staff to maintain social distance.
