CURRENT SITUATION

Situation Summary:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We have six new cases today. Four had symptoms and one is hospitalized. They are a girl under 13, two women in their 20s, a woman in her 30s, a man in his 30s and a man in his 80s. Shasta County is still not one of the 31 counties on the state’s watch list. We don’t want to get any closer than we are, and we can all do our part. Please wear a mask while around others, restrict close contact to household members, practice physical distancing and stay home when you’re sick. There are lots of ways to maintain social connections while maintaining physical distancing. Even a single positive case among employees in a workplace may quickly develop into an outbreak. As outbreak circumstances and work practices vary, employers may need help planning and coordinating a response that meets the needs of the workplace.
