

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING FOR STATE ADMINISTERED CDBG/CDBG-CV APPLICATION**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the County of Shasta will conduct a public meeting on Tuesday, November 17, 2020 at 9:00 AM, at , Board of Supervisor Chambers, 1450 Court Street, Redding, CA 96001 in order to submit under the State Community Development Block Grant Coronavirus Response Round 1 (CDBG-CV1) Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) and solicit public input.

Funding for the State administered CDBG program will be published in a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) each program year. Eligible cities and counties may submit applications for funding according to the NOFA.

Eligible activities under the CDBG program include homeownership assistance and housing rehabilitation programs; public facility and public improvements projects (including public improvements in support of new housing construction); public service programs, planning studies, economic development business assistance and microenterprise activities.

Eligible activities under the CDBG program must meet one of the three national objectives listed in federal statutes: benefit low – moderate income households or persons; elimination of slums and blight; or meeting urgent community development need (with prior department approval).

The County of Shasta anticipates submitting an application under the CDBG-CV1 NOFA in an amount not to exceed \$240,833 under the NOFA for the following eligible activities (activity amounts include Activity Delivery and Admin):

Housing Rehabilitation: COVID -19 Project Homekey Rehabilitation	\$240,833
