Meeting Overview

The meeting was called to order at 2:02 p.m. Introductions were made.

Approval of Meeting Minutes

Financial Report

*AB 109 Public Safety Realignment*

Elaine Grossman distributed a Summary of Realignment and discussed the State estimated allocation amounts, which have decreased for Shasta County. The estimated growth for Fiscal Year (FY) 2015/16 will likely be tied to incentives and performance, such as SB 678 success and reducing prison incarcerations. Elaine also distributed a FY 2015/16 Realignment Revenue Report and stated that the first payment was received as expected.

Executive Committee Activity

Tracie Neal discussed the Executive Committee Activity. She said since July, the Executive Committee has met three times. They have discussed the Collaborative Courts; the upcoming resource fair for offenders, STOPP (Successful Transitions of Probation and Parole); Laura's Law, the Court Grant and Pre-Arrestment Supervised Own Recognizance (PSOR); outcomes for the Day Reporting Center; and an overview for the Probation Department for the last year.

### Announcements and General Discussion

#### *Domestic Violence Programs and Services*

James Goodwine gave an update and overview of the domestic violence programs and services. He stated that the Probation Department uses a risk assessment to determine the risk level of the offenders and that the goal is to stop the violent behavior completely. In February, he had a caseload of 50 offenders. As of October 20, this number has increased to 85. Offenders are being held accountable up front, thanks to local law enforcement and the District Attorney's Office. 29 of the offenders on his caseload were previously convicted for domestic violence charges, not all of which stemmed from Shasta County. James is in the process of re-examining his caseload and is reaching out to service providers and group monitoring. He is asking service providers to include evidence-based practices so outcomes can be tracked.
