Meeting Overview

The meeting was called to order at 3:08 p.m. A quorum was present. Introductions were made.

Public Comment

There was no public comment.

Approval of Meeting Minutes

Robert Paoletti made a motion to approve the minutes. Jeff Gorder seconded the motion. Motion passed 4 Ayes, 0 Noes.

Financial Report

State Allocations to Shasta County

Elaine Grossman distributed a Fiscal Year (FY) 2014/15 Revenue Report and stated that the County revenue is on track. She also distributed a 2011 Public Safety Realignment Revenue (FY 2011-12 through FY 2016-17) sheet which reflects figures from the Governor’s FY 2015-16 Final State Budget and stated that the figures match the Governor’s May Revise. The State will provide updated figures in mid-August 2015. Elaine distributed an AB109 Budget to Actual Report for FY 2011-12 through FY 2015-16.

Planning and Implementation Funds

Erin Ceccarelli distributed the CCP Planning Grant handout and the AB 109 Training and Implementation handout. She stated that there were three new items in planning for HHSa CCP Costs and the Realignment Conference. An addition charge for Mental Health Group Supplies was charged to Training and implementation. The CCP previously approved \$40,000 in Planning and Implementation funds for an evaluation. Probation intends to begin this process and will begin by contacting other counties that have had evaluations.

Discussion Items

Latessa Training

Tracie Neal opened the floor to discuss the Latessa Training. Robert Paoletti indicated that he would like a DVD of the training. Jeff Gorder commented on how the Day Reporting Center is doing a great job at implementing Evidence Based Practices.

Sheriff's Office

Tom Bosenko gave an update from the Sheriff's Office. He stated that the average daily population was 317 with a maximum of 341. There are 267 males and 50 females. 63 sentenced and 254 unsentenced, eight sentenced to one year or more, and eight held in out of county beds. There are 148 on alternative custody, 134 on work release, and 37 in the STEP-UP Program (10 with Sheriff, 14 with Probation, five with California Heritage Youth Build Academy (CHYBA), and eight with Good News Rescue Mission (GNRM)). There are 81 Global Positioning Satellite units in use, 14 on Home Electronic Confinement (HEC). Totals for AB109: 10 contacts, 11 searches, four arrests. The team seized: 11.1 ounces of Meth, one pound of Marijuana, 17.64 grams Hash, 3.17 grams Heroin, 90 Hydrocodone pills, \$5,000 asset forfeiture from a subject that was determined to be a 290 PC Reg. and convicted felon for drug sales. The team also recovered a stolen 1972 Charger and a stolen Ruger Single Six .22 cal. Revolver. Totals for Shasta County Most Wanted is 422; 36 are outstanding; 12 are in custody, 11 of which are unsentenced and one is pending prison.

The 64-bed medium-security facility is moving forward. They were not approved for an additional 64 beds. The facility should be opening in late 2018.

City of Redding's Strategic Plan

Robert Paoletti reported on the Strategic Plan stating that Matrix Consulting is conducting detailed data analysis and a staffing study. The study will be complete in late August.

Tom Bosenko stated that the Sheriff's Office surveyed jobs and population in regard to bookings and staffing. Overall, they need more staffing to cover the needs of the County.

Court Grant Pre-arraignment Program

Ruby Fierro reported on the Court Grant Pre-arraignment Program stating that the grant funded a Deputy Probation Officer III and a Probation Assistant for screening offenders for the Pretrial Supervised Own Recognizance program. The program started in June. The grant program funds 1 Deputy Probation Officer III and a Probation Assistant. The SOR team is now working 4, 10 hour shifts in order to allow additional support on the weekend and to the PSOR program.. To date the program has not resulted in as many offenders qualifying for the program because many of the offenders booked in the jail fall outside the qualification parameters that have been set. 83 bookings were screened the weekend of the 11th and 12th of July. Of those, most were automatically screened out for the following reasons: one for Domestic Violence, 35 misdemeanors, 13 drunk in public, 16 sentenced, 10 already supervised. In addition, there were 10 who potentially qualified but were released before Probation could get there. Probation is looking into ways they can increase the population that they can serve with this grant. There is a good foundation in place, and the jail staff has been cooperative.

Action Items

BI/DRC Outcome Measurements

Tracie Neal opened the floor to discuss the proposed Day Reporting Center outcome measurements for 2015. Jeff Gorder put forward the idea of having Phase goals within the categories. Amanda Owens said that the Day Reporting Center will bring new baselines for Phase goals. This action item will be brought back in the next meeting.

Other items for discussion/future agenda items

Tracie Neal opened the floor for future agenda items before the Operational Update of the Tour of the Redding Police Department Station. Robert Paoletti suggested that, at the next Executive Committee meeting, the committee discuss combining the Advisory and Executive meetings quarterly instead of having two separate meetings.

Operational Updates

Tour of Redding Police Department Station

The committee members received a tour of the new Redding Police Department Station.
