Meeting Overview

The meeting was called to order at 3:05 p.m. A quorum was present. Introductions were made.

Public Comment

There was no public comment.

Approval of Meeting Minutes

Jeff Gorder made a motion to approve the minutes. Donnell Ewert and Melissa Fowler-Bradly abstained. A vote did not take place.

Financial Report

*State Allocations to Shasta County*

Elaine Grossman distributed an updated Fiscal Year 2014/15 2011 Realignment Revenue Report and stated that the County revenue is above the anticipated target.

*Planning and Implementation Funds*

Erin Ceccarelli distributed the CCP Planning Grant handout. She stated that there were no new charges in Training and Implementation but there were three additional items in the Planning Grant.

### Discussion Items

#### *Probation/Parole Community Services (PAC)*

Chelsey Chappelle reported on the Probation/Parole Community Services (PAC) project stating that it is a meeting designed to bring together population coming out of custody to have easy access to available services with a goal of starting in October or November.

Tracie Neal stated that it will take place the second Monday of each month at the Veteran's Hall, offenders referred to it will be from Probation or Parole, and it will be a one-stop location for access to services in order to get people more involved and have quicker access to services. We want them to walk away having signed up for something.

Melissa Fowler-Bradley asked how many people would be in attendance each month and whether it would be voluntary or mandatory.

Tracie stated that a maximum of 75 offenders would be invited per month, but they would also have service providers, mentors, and a guest speaker. We are hoping to start and invest in the future. The attendance would be mandatory. We are also hoping to get the Redding Police Department and Sheriff's Office involved in the project. Chelsey stated that she often hears that things are overwhelming for offenders just being released, and this could take off some of the pressure.

#### *Collaborative Courts*

Chelsey stated that the collaborative courts have been running for over a year and introduced T.J. Fallon and Meghan Hart who will be giving the overviews of the programs.

T.J. Fallon reported on the Re-Entry Court stating that it is a four-tiered program. They have received 51 referrals, 13 of which did not participate. One third of the participants are progressing successfully. There were two graduates from the program, so far. T.J. is hoping to up the caseload to 30 participants.

Meghan Hart reported on the Behavioral Health Court stating that it is also a four-tiered program for offenders with mental illness particularly for crimes committed as a result of mental illness. The overall goal is to reduce recidivism. There are currently 17 participants on two tracks. They had their first graduation in June. The next graduation will be in December or January.

#### *Public Safety Blueprint*

Representatives from the Sheriff's Office provided updates on the Public Safety Blueprint. Eric Magrini stated that they have completed a preliminary report. Janet Breshears stated that the survey they completed will help with the blueprint. They are on track to be completed next month.

## Action Items

### *BI/DRC Outcome Measurements*

The committee discussed the DRC Outcome Measurements and clarified what each statistic meant. Jeff Gorder asked that the committee consider getting a completion percentage as a gauge of a success rate or a graduation rate. Donnell Ewert supported the idea of a completion percentage. The committee will revisit this item next month.

### *Community Recidivism Grants for 2015/16*

Tracie gave an overview of what the grant is, which service providers have been awarded grants, and the amounts that were awarded. The Governor has allocated additional funds resulting in Shasta County being awarded an additional \$25,000. In order to receive these funds, Shasta County will have to submit another letter of interest. This motion is to approve the use of the same requirements, criteria, limits, procedures, and reporting as last year, with new language so that we do not have to return to the Board for further amendments. Donnell Ewert made a motion to approve the action. Melissa Fowler-Bradley seconded the motion. Motion passed: 4 Ayes, 0 Noes.

## Operational Updates

Eric Magrini gave an update from the Sheriff's Office. He stated that the average daily population was 334. There are 279 males (215 unsentenced) and 55 females (45 unsentenced). Eight are sentenced to more than 1 year, and seven are held in out of county beds. There are 135 on alternative custody: 127 on work release, 28 in the STEP-UP program (11 with Sheriff, 9 with Probation, and 8 with Good News Rescue Mission). There are 82 Global Positioning Satellite units in use, 8 on Home Electronic Confinement. Totals for Shasta County Sheriff's Office AB109: 3 contacts, 3 searches, and 0 arrests. Good service was made on 3 subjects with outstanding warrants. A total of 8 warrants were cleared by the team in July. The team seized: 2.38 grams of Meth, 23.71 grams of Heroin, 8 Prescription pills, a stolen vehicle, and three memorial flags that were returned to the proper service member's families.
