Meeting Overview:

The meeting was called to order at approximately 3:00 p.m. Introductions were made.

Public Comments:

Program Updates

A PowerPoint handout was distributed and discussed. As of the end of March 2012:

- 258 offenders have reported to Probation (12 transfers from other counties).
- Shasta County has a 95% show rate.
- The Compliance Team attempted 61 contacts and connected with 37 offenders; conducted 35 searches and made two arrests.
- The third floor of the jail is ready for housing 128 inmates; recruiting continues and appropriate staffing is anticipated for summer 2012.
- The Work Release Program for 200 is being run out of the jail and there are 160 people in the program. There was general discussion regarding the consequences of non-compliance.
- The Home Electronic Confinement (HEC) Program is currently at 30; staff is working to place more offenders in the program. When this program is fully staffed in FY 12/13, probation staff (with varied hours) and jail staff (four shifts) will be working toward placing more offenders in the program.

- The RFP process for the Day Reporting Center is complete. Behavioral Interventions was chosen to provide services at the Assessment Center. Post-Release Community Supervision/Mandatory Supervision offenders will report to the Assessment Center and be assessed; 50 will be assigned to the Day Reporting Center. The search for an Assessment Center location is ongoing.
- There was general discussion regarding mental health needs of the offenders; Probation/HHSA team is working toward providing and contracting for needed services. A chart showing various referrals made through the end of March was distributed and discussed.
- 192 health assessment reports were completed through the end of February 2012 (98 applications were submitted); 60 general assistance inquiries were made (24 applications were approved).
- Recruitment/hiring process for all realignment allocated positions is ongoing.
- State funding to Shasta County is on track.

Proposed FY 12/13 Implementation Plan and Budget

The Community Corrections Partnership Executive Committee has approved the 12/13 budget. A handout was distributed and there was general discussion.

SB 678 Update

The SB 678 Update was tabled to the next meeting.

Other Matters or Concerns

There was general discussion regarding the homeless and the need for transitional housing for AB109 offenders.

There was some discussion about getting information to the public via Twitter, press releases, etc.
