Meeting Overview:

The meeting was called to order at 3:00 p.m. Introductions were made.

Public Comment

No public comment.

Approval of Minutes

Meeting minutes of December 19, 2012, were reviewed. Jeff Gorder motioned for approval of the minutes and the motion was seconded by Melissa Fowler-Bradley. 4 Ayes, 0 Noes, 0 Abstain.

Financial Report

Julie Hope distributed a revenue handout and an SB1020/1022 handout. Revenues are on monthly target. Growth funds will be allocated the year following the year growth occurred. Figures for 11/12 through 13/14 are set. The numbers for following years may change.

Action items:

- A. There is currently a sunset date of June 30, 2013 for all AB 109 allocated positions. Now that the governor's constitutional guarantee went through, the sunset dates should be removed. Jeff Gorder motioned for the removal of the sunset dates and the motion was seconded by Melissa Fowler-Bradley. 4 Ayes, 0 Noes, 0 Abstain. It will be taken care of at the February 5, 2013, meeting as part of the January clean-up.

- B. Meeting schedules for the CCP and the CCPEC were reviewed. Robert Paoletti motioned for approval of the proposed meeting schedule and the motion was seconded by Jeff Gorder. 4 Ayes, 0 Noes, 0 Abstain.
- C. The topic of in-custody medical costs was tabled to the next meeting, as Sheriff Bosenko was not present.

Discussion Items

- A. The Data Committee met on January 16th. A handout showing data collection by agency was distributed and discussed. There was general discussion regarding what data should be collected. It was decided that the Executive Committee would provide direction as to what data would be collected. It was suggested that the Data Committee move forward to track progress of items in the plan, plus extra items such as measures of success. There was a request to include data collection on a future agenda.
- B. The fifth draft of the supportive housing contract with Northern Valley Catholic Social Service is at County Counsel for approval. It should be presented to the Board of Supervisors in February.
- C. The goal of the employment/training/education project is to link those who are released to the community to jobs. There was general discussion regarding the duties of the full-time Employment & Training Worker included in the 2013 Plan. Committee members were asked to present some recommendations at future meetings. There was discussion regarding funded vocational training at Shasta College.
- D. The Public Defender's Office is in the process of hiring an extra help social worker. An AB 109 attorney will start in February to work with Post Release Community Supervision violators assisting them to find resources to help them. The attorney will work with Probation. Assisting those on mandatory supervision to encourage them to go to court, appointments, etc., may be included in the future.
- E. Court Failures To Appear continue to be a significant problem. There was general discussion on the topic. The Courts and Probation are working toward Supervised Own Recognizance (SOR) and will be moving forward shortly. SOR may free up some bed space that may be used to hold offenders for sentencing.

There was general discussion regarding the use of GPS ankle bracelets to get offenders to court. It was determined that SOR needs to be in place first. Currently there are three offenders out on GPS. That will increase with time.

There was discussion regarding sending sentenced offenders to contract beds to free up space in Shasta County jail beds. There are currently 19 placed in out-of-county beds and the projection is to increase that to 20-25. The \$500,000 allocation should last through the end of the year.

- F. Committee members discussed the Realignment Conference held in Sacramento in early November. There was general discussion regarding what are measuring aspects to determine success and educating citizens on what is going on. The public is receiving a lot of bad information. All agencies need to be on the same page and talk in a unified manner, while getting good information out to the public.
- G. Kern County's request to the Governor for additional AB 109 funds and changes in the three strikes law due to Proposition 36 were tabled for the next meeting.

Operational Updates

The lease for the Day Reporting Center was approved by the Board of Supervisors. There will be weekly status meetings with the contractor doing the renovations.

Contracts continue to be processed.

There are approximately 330 AB 109 offenders being supervised by the Probation Department.
