2. Resident had a scratch on his elbow from a physical altercation. He was checked and cleared by medical.

3. Resident injured his left finger while playing basketball. He was given a bag of ice.

4. Resident was seen laying on her room floor with what looked to be blood near her arm. When taken to booking to be checked she stated she only picked an old scab, she was not trying to harm herself.

5. Resident hit their head on the floor while being restrained. No further details where provided.

6. Resident used a paint chip to cut her arm. She was taken to booking where her cut was cleaned, she was given a shower, and she was cleared back to her room.

7. Resident used a paint chip to cut her forearm. Medical was called and advised to send her to bed once she was done being counseled and all paint chips were removed from her room.

8. Resident stated he was going to kill himself if he wasn't taken to booking. Once in booking he stated to take him to the hospital or he would "fucking" kill someone. Once he was placed in the visiting sally he began to hit his head on the window. Mental health advised to put him in a safety gown and to continue to observe him.

9. Reident was observed in her room with a large gash on her wrist. She refused commands to stop cutting herself. Once in the room and the paint chip was taken medical advised to place her in a safety smock and observed. She had a another chip and cut herself again where she was taken to a safety cell in booking.

4. Resident fell off his sink and said it felt like he broke his neck. The on-call dr. advised to give him tylenol and to follow up with the nurse in the am.

5. Resident punched his wall and his knuckles were sore and red. He declined ice and medical.

6. Resident fell while playing basketball. His wrist was sore and he was given a bag of ice and he then returned to L.M.E.

7. **Suicidal Ideation:** Resident was observed using a spork to try and cut her arm. When the arm was checked by medical, no new wounds were found.

1. Resident woke up complaining of chest pain, a painful cough, and stuff nose. His vitals were taken and the on-call Dr. advised to let the resident sleep and follow-up with medical in the morning.

2. Resident stated he was not feeling well. He was placed in his room with the door open for observation. He was later observed to be having what looked like a seizure. He was taken to the hospital for observation and further evaluation.

3. **Suicidal Ideation:** Resident was upset about her diabetic diet. She ripped out her insulin pump and said she did not care anymore. On-call Dr. was called and advised to give her insulin manually since it was thought she would use insulin to overdose and to follow-up with medical in the morning.

4. **Suicidal Ideation:** Resident was observed with a sweatshirt tied around her neck saying she was going to kill herself. She was taken from her room and said, "See, now you guys care!" She was cuffed and a supervisor counseled her and she gave believable commitment she was not a harm to herself.

2. Resident stated she fell from her sink and hit her head which caused some bleeding from her nose,. The on-call doctor advise to give her a bag of ice and to re evaluate her in an hour. The nose had stopped bleeding and the nurse followed up in the morning.

3. Resident was found attempting to cut across her wrists with an unknown item. Upon entry to her room she several artificial scratches that were inflamed with no bleeding. On-call doctor advised to keep the scratches clean.

4. Resident was found with a drawing depicting a person hanging in his room. Next to his bed was was a ripped blanket in what coul dhave been used to harm himself. Resdent stated he no longer felt the urge to harm himself, just at the time he drew the picture. He was counseled. - SUICIDAL IDEATION

1. Resident stated he split his chin open and was bleeding. The on-call doctor instructed to give the resident an alcohol wipe to clean the wound, a Band-Aid, and Tylenol for pain. Follow up in the am with the nurse.

2. Resident was seen using a broken comb to try and cut herself. The on-call doctor was notified and advised to give the resident safety bedding and to go 15 minute room checks through the night.

3. Suicidal Ideation: Resident made suicidal statements and was counseled as to take it seriously and not to make statements like that just to get her way.

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
