1. During a physical altercation, two residents ended up with minor bruising and pain. One resident was given Tylenol and a bag of ice for her eye, and the other Tylenol and a bag of ice for pain on the back of her head.

2. **Suicidal Ideation:** Resident was feeling down and stated she had used her fingernails to scratch herself. On-call doctor was called and advised to place her in a safety cell and be given a smock and safety blanket. She was placed on Enhanced Observation over night.

3. **Suicidal Ideation:** Resident was angry and yelled he wanted to kill himself, he just wanted to die. On-call doctor advised tot ake all items from his room. Resident then wrapped his shirt around his neck and refused orders to remove it. Room entry was made to a flooded room, and the shirt was retrieved.

4. Resident woke up with a pain in his stomach. On-call doctor advised to give him 600mg Ibuprofen and to monitor the pain. The medicine brought the pain down.

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
