Dear Ms. Russell:

We have completed our final review of the *Shasta County and City of Anderson Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan*, officially adopted by Shasta County and the City of Anderson on November 7, 2017, and found the plan to be in conformance with Title 44 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 201.6 *Local Mitigation Plans*. A list of the status of participating jurisdictions is enclosed with this letter.

The approval of this plan ensures Shasta County's and the City of Anderson's continued eligibility for project grants under FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Assistance programs, including the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, Pre-Disaster Mitigation Program, and Flood Mitigation Assistance Program. All requests for funding, however, will be evaluated individually according to the specific eligibility, and other requirements of the particular program under which applications are submitted.

Also, approved hazard mitigation plans are eligible for points under the National Flood Insurance Program's Community Rating System (CRS). Additional information regarding the CRS can be found at <https://www.fema.gov/national-flood-insurance-program-community-rating-system> or through your local floodplain manager.

FEMA's approval of the *Shasta County and City of Anderson Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan* is for a period of five years, effective starting the date of this letter. Prior to November 16, 2022, Shasta County and the City of Anderson are required to review and revise the plan to reflect changes in development, progress in local mitigation efforts, and changes in priorities, and resubmit it for approval in order to continue to be eligible for mitigation project grant funding. The enclosed plan review tool provides additional recommendations to incorporate into the plan during the plan maintenance process.
