Extension of Residential “Door-Yard” Burning

The City of Redding is again extending “Door-Yard” burning until the end of January 2022 or until the weather no longer supports favorable open burning conditions. Please take advantage of the great weather and get out and work on the defensible space around your home and property. The Redding Fire Department offers two types of required permits, the Door-Yard and the Fuel Mitigation Permit. The Door-Yard permit is free and the Fuel Mitigation permit costs \$16 and requires an inspection by a Redding Fire Inspector. Both permits can be obtained by visiting www.cityofredding.org/departments/fire-department. Please follow the burning regulations. Should you decide not to burn, but still have vegetative debris to eliminate, below are some options:

1. Consider chipping your woody materials. Chipping can be a good option as long as the chipped materials are spread out to a depth of not more than 2”.
2. Utilize your green waste bin. The vegetative materials will need to be cut into pieces no longer than 3.5 feet and no larger than 4” in diameter.
3. The City of Redding Transfer Station located at 2255 Abernathy Lane in Redding, will accept vegetative debris for a fee. Visit www.cityofredding.org or call 530-225-6201 for additional information.
4. Sustainable Resource Management, formerly Wheelabrator in Anderson, will accept tree trimmings for no fee as long as there are no shrubs or grasses in the load. Visit www.wastebits.com or call 530-339-7600 for more information.
5. The West Central Landfill located at 14095 Clear Creek Road, in Igo and the Waste Management Anderson Landfill located at 18703 Cambridge Road, in Anderson will accept vegetative debris for a fee.
6. Contact a vegetation reduction contractor. Both the Redding Fire Department and the Shasta Lake Fire Protection District maintain a list of fuel break and vegetation management contractors within Shasta County. We do not endorse any particular contractor.
