## Keeping Shasta County Clean

Back during the warm days of August and September, the Shasta County Department of Resource Management held three household hazardous waste (HHW) collection events in Burney, Lakehead, and Shingletown. At each event, residents were able to rid their homes of 483 pounds of fluorescent lamps, 550 gallons of used oil, nearly four tons of televisions and computer monitors, another two tons of other types of electronics, and more.



All of these items have the potential to contaminate water systems or harm people and animals if left to deteriorate or disposed of improperly. We took great care to guarantee our community's safety by partnering with Clean Harbors, Inc., who transported the items out of Shasta County for recycling or proper disposal.

Besides helping to keep the county clean, the events allowed Resource Management staff the opportunity to meet residents and share information on recycling and waste reduction.

## The Why, Where, and How of Disposing of Unused Meds

According to [www.rxsafeshasta.com](http://www.rxsafeshasta.com), Shasta County's site for information on where and how to dispose of unused or expired medications, "over 53% of those who misused prescription pain medications say they got them from a friend or family often getting them easily within the home." Due to the increasing rates of abuse of prescription narcotics, it is now more important than ever to properly dispose of unused medications.

Shasta County makes the disposal of unused medications easy with FREE 24-hour drop-off kiosks conveniently located at

To use the kiosks, remove medications from containers and place them in a ziplock bag. Different medications can be mixed in the same bag. Liquids, powders, and ointments can be left in their original containers (as long as they are tightly capped) and then bagged. Remove any identifying information, such as names or addresses. Do not place sharps or illegal drugs in the kiosks.

## Curbside Collection Reminders

### Christmas Tree Removal

Christmas Trees are picked up by Burney Disposal, Inc. during the month following Christmas. Be sure to remove all decorations and lights, then cut your tree into 4-foot or smaller sections.

### Fireplace Ash

If you throw your fireplace ash away, first make sure it is cool, then put it in a bag before placing it in your trash bin. Doing so helps keep garbage truck drivers safe and helps prevent fires from starting in the bin and the hoppers of the trucks.

### Snow

Make sure to remove all snow from in front of your bins to maintain regular pickups.

If snow or unsafe conditions keep drivers from reaching customers, Burney Disposal will pick up twice the amount the following week, at no additional charge. For more information on the "Snow Credit" program, contact their office at (530) 335-2723.

## What is E-Waste?

Did you receive a new smartphone, laptop, or gaming system this holiday season? Once you powered it up and installed all of the updates, you probably looked over at last year's cracked or out-of-date device and thought, "what do I do with this?"

Electronics nearing the end of their useful lives are called "E-Waste" (electronic waste) and cannot be thrown in the trash. Beyond electronic devices, e-waste includes power and peripheral cables, chargers, printer cartridges, USB sticks, computer mice, earbuds, and a list of tech that keeps us connected every day.

While many items can be reused, sometimes one just needs to be discarded. Wherever you are in the county, we can tell you where to easily drop-off your e-waste for recycling.
