



## **ZOGG FIRE DEBRIS REMOVAL WARNING**

Shasta County is working closely with the Governor's Office of Emergency Services regarding the recovery phase of the Zogg Fire. However, at this time it is not known if there will be State or Federal assistance for the debris removal process. **PLEASE BE ADVISED that if you remove fire debris or disturb the ash footprint, you may be ineligible for any State or Federal debris removal assistance.** A State-facilitated debris removal program, if offered, could be of great benefit to those with or without insurance. In any event, **a Demolition Permit is required before removing fire debris;** a permit is not required to remove personal property.

### **CAUTION**

**ASH & DEBRIS MAY BE HOT AND CONTAIN HAZARDOUS MATERIALS. USE APPROPRIATE RESPIRATORY PROTECTION, GLOVES, DISPOSABLE COVERALLS, FOOTWEAR, GOGGLES & HARDHAT.**

**DO NOT DISTURB ASH WITH LEAF BLOWERS. ASH SHOULD BE WETTED TO PREVENT AIRBORNE EMISSIONS, BUT SHOULD NOT BE SATURATED TO THE POINT OF RUNOFF.**
