## CURRENT SITUATION

- We had a total of 125 cases on Thursday, including 55 men and 70 women:
  - 6 children under age 13
  - 17 teenagers
  - 19 people in their 20s
  - 17 people in their 30s
  - 20 people in their 40s
  - 21 people in their 50s
  - 16 people in their 60s
  - 4 people in their 70s
  - 2 people in their 80s
  - 2 people over age 89
  - 1 person of unknown age
- We are sorry to have to report a death today. The patient was a man in his 70s.
- Ten years. That’s the average length of time lost to a Shasta County resident who dies prematurely due to COVID. The calculation estimates the number of years a person would have lived if they had not died prematurely. Deaths are considered premature if they individual’s age is under the average life expectancy. So far, COVID has contributed to 225 years of potential life lost in Shasta County. Life expectancy in Shasta County is 76.2 years.
