### CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 31 cases Tuesday, including 16 men, 15 women:
  - 3 children under age 13
  - 3 teenagers
  - 6 people in their 20s
  - 5 people in their 30s
  - 5 people in their 40s
  - 4 people in their 50s
  - 4 people in their 60s
  - 1 person in their 80s
- This report includes a weekly update to our total case numbers, as we have been conducting case investigations to correct reported cases that were duplicates or out-of-county records.
- Question:** Is parental consent required before teens age 12-17 can get the vaccine? **Answer:** Yes, a parent or guardian should attend the vaccination appointment with their child but may be able to provide written consent if they are unable to attend in person. Each Shasta County vaccine provider will have their own consent process, so check with your provider.
