



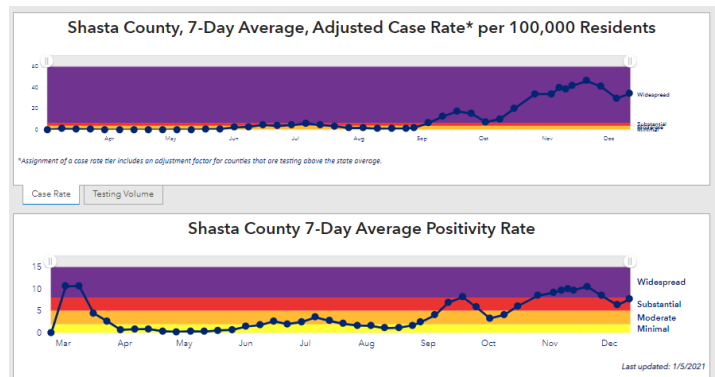
# COVID-19 INCIDENT UPDATE: January 5, 2021

Statistics from January 3 and 4, 2021

## CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 195 cases on Sunday and Monday, including 88 men, 103 women and 4 people of unknown gender:
  - 15 children under age 13
  - 21 teenagers
  - 21 people in their 20s
  - 45 people in their 30s
  - 18 people in their 40s
  - 22 people in their 50s
  - 20 people in their 60s
  - 15 people in their 70s
  - 10 people in their 80s
  - 5 people over age 89
  - 3 people of unknown age



- We are sorry to have to report a death today. The person was a man over age 89.
- Shasta County remains in the purple (“widespread”) tier. Our adjusted case rate increased from 29.9 to 34.1 daily cases per 100,000 residents. The unadjusted case rate is 30.9, but was adjusted up because the county’s per capita testing volume is lower than the state average. Our positivity rate increased from 6.3% to 7.6%. **COVID-19 Vaccine Rollout**

**Phase 1a: 3 Tiers** (Persons at risk of exposure to COVID-19 through work in any role in direct health care or long-term care settings. \*Where restrictions have been initiated.)

- Vaccinating Now Tier 1:**
  - Acute care, psychiatric and correctional facility hospitals
  - Staff and residents of skilled nursing facilities, assisted living facilities, and similar settings for aged or medically vulnerable individuals
  - Staff of residential substance abuse treatment (SUD) treatment centers
  - Staff of residential behavioral health facilities
  - Lawenforcement, sheriff and others providing emergency medical services
  - Cruise services
- Vaccinating Next Tier 2:**
  - Intermediate care, for persons who need non-residential nursing, supervision and supportive care
  - Home health care and in-home supportive services
  - Staff of independent substance use disorder (SUD) treatment centers
  - Staff of independent behavioral health programs
  - Community health workers, including promotoras
  - Public health field staff with patient contact
  - Primary care clinics, including Federally Qualified Health Centers, Rural Health Centers, Community Health Centers and urgent care clinics
- Vaccinating Soon Tier 3:**
  - Specialty clinics
  - Laboratory workers
  - Dental and oral health clinics
  - Pharmacy staff not working in settings at higher tiers

**Phase 1b Tier 1:**

- Individuals age 75 years and older
- Workers in educational/care
- Workers in emergency services
- Workers in food and agriculture

**Phase 1b Tier 2:**

- Individuals age 65 and older with underlying medical condition or disability
- Workers in transportation/logistics, industrial, residential or commercial building, critical infrastructure
- Disparitized individuals
- Immigrant/undocumented individuals

**Phase 1c:**

- Individuals 50-64 years of age
- Individuals between ages 18 and 64 who have an underlying health condition or disability which increases their risk of severe COVID-19
- Those at risk of exposure to work in other settings: intensive, nursing, chemical and biological laboratories, operations, and community based essential functions

\*Currently, there are limited supplies of vaccines. This information will be updated when supplies improve.
