## **CURRENT SITUATION**

## **Situation Summary:**

- We have 5 new cases today. All had symptoms and none are hospitalized. They are a teenage boy, a man in his 20s, a man in his 30s, a man in his 60s, and a man in his 70s.
- Shasta County's investigation team has been extremely busy in recent weeks, as they are
  working with more than 200 people currently in isolation and quarantine. Learn more
