



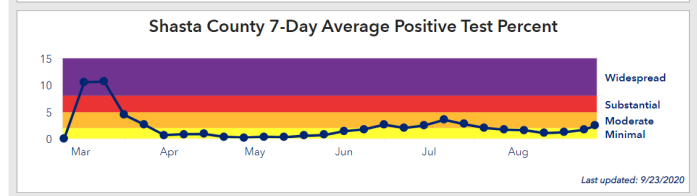
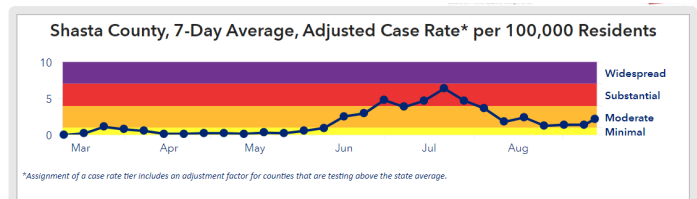
COVID-19 INCIDENT UPDATE: September 23, 2020

Statistics from September 22, 2020

CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 27 new cases on Tuesday. Twenty-four had symptoms (one is unknown) and none of these new patients are hospitalized. They are:
 - One teenage girl and two teenage boys
 - Eight women and one man in their 20s
 - Four women and two men in their 30s
 - One woman and three men in their 40s
 - One woman in her 50s
 - Two women and one man in their 60s
 - One man in his 80s
- Shasta County remains in the orange (“moderate”) range after Tuesday’s statewide data update. Our case rate increased from 1.4 to 2.2 daily cases per 100,000 residents, and our positivity rate increased from 1.7 to 2.4 percent. These numbers are a seven-day average with a seven-day lag, so they cover Sept. 8-15. Learn more at ShastaReady.org; click “Data and Statistics.”
