



COVID-19 INCIDENT UPDATE: September 30, 2020

CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 27 new cases on Tuesday. Twenty-three had symptoms and two are hospitalized. They are:
 - Four women and eight men in their 20s
 - Four women and two men in their 30s
 - One man in his 40s
 - Three women in their 50s
 - Two men in their 60s
 - Two men in their 70s
 - A woman over age 89
- The total case count has been reduced by 2, as two patients were counted twice.
- **Get set:** Prepare your family and home ahead of time for the possibility of having to evacuate. Ensure you have a plan of what to take and where to go – evacuation plans will be different this year due to COVID-19. If you do need to evacuate and plan to stay with friends or relatives, ask first if they have symptoms of COVID-19 or have people in their home at higher risk for serious illness. If that is the case, make other arrangements. Check with hotels, motels and campgrounds to learn if they are open.
