CURRENT SITUATION

- We had a total of 133 new cases on Friday and Saturday, including 56 men, 75 women and 2 unknown. The new cases are:
 - 7 children under age 13
 - 9 teenagers
 - 21 people in their 20s
 - 21 people in their 30s
 - 17 people in their 40s
 - 30 people in their 50s
 - 14 people in their 60s
 - 8 people in their 70s
 - 5 people in their 80s
 - 1 person of unknown age
- We are sorry to have to report a death today. The patient was a woman in her 80s.
- Every year, the Shasta County Health and Human Services Agency encourages residents over 6 months of age to get their flu shots. This is now more important than ever, as this year promises to be an extra-complicated respiratory virus season for our healthcare providers. Flu shots are free by appointment at the Public Health clinic, and are easily accessible through your primary care provider and local pharmacies, many of which offer coupons or discounts on purchases when you get your flu shot there. - Since 2005, Shasta County has had the following number of annual deaths by flu: 1, 0, 1, 3, 1, 0, 0, 1, 1, 3, 1, 5, 6, 19, 2 and 3.
