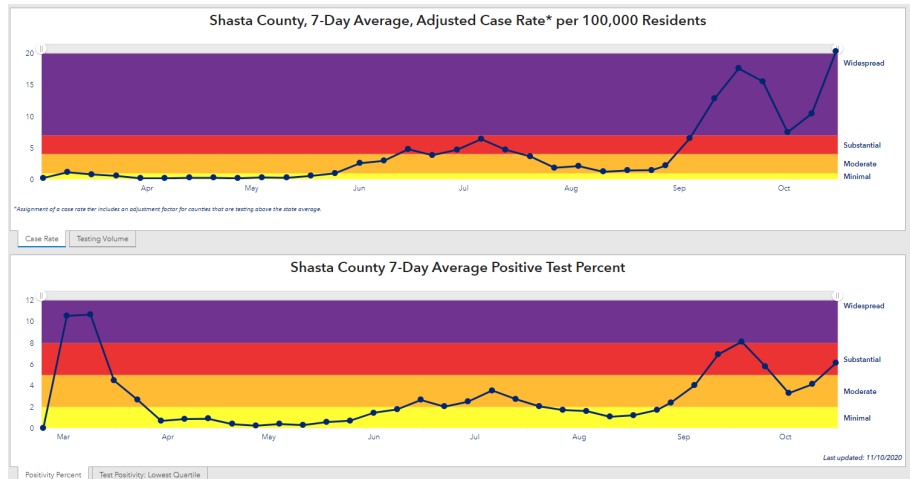
Statistics from November 8 and 9, 2020

CURRENT SITUATION

- We had a total of 111 new cases on Sunday and Monday, including 54 men and 57 women. They are:

- 2 children under age 13
- 10 teenagers
- 31 people in their 20s
- 18 people in their 30s
- 17 people in their 40s
- 10 people in their 50s
- 14 people in their 60s
- 5 people in their 70s
- 4 people in their 80s



- Shasta County has fallen deeper into the purple (“widespread”) tier. Our adjusted case rate increased from 10.4 to 20.2 daily cases per 100,000

residents, which exceeds the purple tier limit of 7.0. Our positivity rate also increased from 4.1% to 6.1%, which is in the red (“substantial”) tier. Our [health equity quartile positivity rate](#) is 5.6%, which is also in the red tier. These numbers are a seven-day average with a seven-day lag (Oct. 25-31).
