CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 110 new cases on Tuesday, including 45 men, 64 women and one unknown gender/age:
 - 2 children under age 13
 - 7 teenagers
 - 19 people in their 20s
 - 23 people in their 30s
 - 17 people in their 40s
 - 23 people in their 50s
 - 12 people in their 60s
 - 5 people in their 70s
 - 1 person in their 80s
- We are sorry to have to report a death today. The patient was a woman in her 70s.
- *Due to high case counts and delays in lab reporting, public health is unable to provide timely education to all COVID-19 cases in our community, and therefore, we do not have an accurate count of people who are on isolation or quarantine. People who test positive should self-isolate and notify their close contacts. Instructions can be found at ShastaReady.org under “Quarantine and Isolation.”
- This report represents an update to our total case numbers, as we have been conducting case investigations to correct reported cases that were duplicates, people who live in another county, or people who were previously counted but later turned out not to be a case.
