CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 198 cases on Tuesday, including 100 men, 97 women and 1 person of unknown gender:
 - 4 children under age 13
 - 17 teenagers
 - 39 people in their 20s
 - 30 people in their 30s
 - 30 people in their 40s
 - 36 people in their 50s
 - 21 people in their 60s
 - 14 people in their 70s
 - 6 people in their 80s
 - 1 person over age 89
- We are sorry to have to report four deaths today. They are a man in his 50s, a woman in her 50s, a man in his 80s and a woman over age 89.
- This report represents a weekly update to our case numbers to correct reported cases that were duplicates, out-of-county records, or people who were previously counted but later turned out to not be a case.
- It's a potentially uncomfortable but important conversation this year: The COVID chat.
 - Do:**
 - Be clear: Say "no" to anything that could increase risk for you or the people you care about
 - Offer alternatives: Ask if there's another way to connect with family and share the experience
 - Drop off holiday meals for older loved ones and those with medical conditions, so they can stay home
 - Plan safe celebrations well in advance, then stick to the plan
 - Be honest: Remind people you care about them and need to take precautions for everyone's health
 - Don't:**
 - Plan celebrations with multiple households
 - Make someone feel guilty for not wanting to gather in person
 - Ridicule someone for wanting to take precautions
 - Feel pressured to take risks you're not comfortable with
 - Forget to be compassionate, even when turning down an invitation
