**CURRENT SITUATION**

- We had 117 cases on Wednesday, including 55 men, 59 women and 3 people of unknown gender:
  - 6 children under age 13
  - 9 teenagers
  - 19 people in their 20s
  - 14 people in their 30s
  - 20 people in their 40s
  - 20 people in their 50s
  - 14 people in their 60s
  - 7 people in their 70s
  - 6 people in their 80s
  - 2 people over age 89
- As a health department, our goal is to ensure everyone in the county is safe and healthy — especially during challenging times like these. In Shasta County, we have come together and supported one another through wildfires and other hard times. We know that our essential workers have been hit especially hard by COVID. These essential jobs often carry a greater risk of exposure, so we must take steps to ensure our workers are protected. Our goal is to bring down the case rate and reduce the number of people who are exposed, sick, face long-term health consequences, or lose their lives from COVID while ensuring that we also support the economic well-being of all Shasta County residents.
