



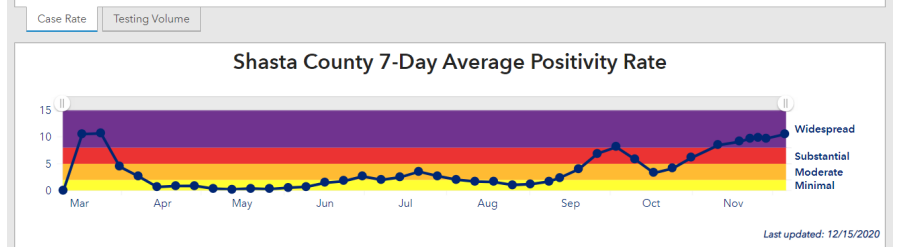
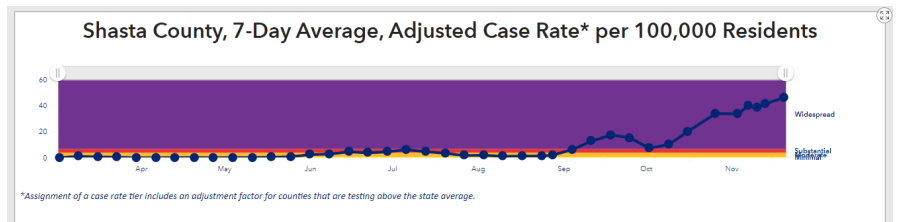
COVID-19 INCIDENT UPDATE: December 15, 2020

Statistics from December 13 and 14, 2020

CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 150 cases on Sunday and Monday, including 76 men, 73 women and 1 person of unknown gender:
 - 1 child under age 13
 - 20 teenagers
 - 26 people in their 20s
 - 30 people in their 30s
 - 16 people in their 40s
 - 23 people in their 50s
 - 21 people in their 60s
 - 8 people in their 70s
 - 4 people in their 80s
 - 0 people over age 89
 - 1 person of unknown age



- We are sorry to have to report 4 deaths today. The patients were three men in their 70s and a man in his 80s.
- Shasta County remains in the purple (“widespread”) tier. Our adjusted case rate increased from 41.6 to 46.2 daily cases per 100,000 residents. The unadjusted case rate is 57.4, but was adjusted down because the county’s per capita testing volume is higher than the state average. Our positivity rate increased from 9.7% to 10.5%. - COVID vaccine has arrived in Shasta County! Today, 1,950 doses of Pfizer vaccine were received at Mercy Medical Center. They will be distributed among other acute care facilities in a coordinated effort. Future deliveries will be made directly to the acute care facilities. The county is tentatively scheduled to receive 530 more doses of Pfizer vaccine and about 2,000 doses of the Moderna vaccine next week.
