- We had 21 cases Friday and Saturday, including 6 men and 15 women:
 - 1 child under age 13
 - 2 teenagers
 - 2 people in their 20s
 - 2 people in their 30s
 - 3 people in their 40s
 - 5 people in their 50s
 - 2 people in their 60s
 - 2 people in their 70s
 - 2 people of unknown age
- **SECOND DOSE CLINIC:** If you received your first dose of Moderna at Shasta College on Feb. 5 or 6 (or earlier), please come to a second-dose clinic on Friday, March 5 or Saturday, March 6, at Shasta College. Other second dose clinics have been scheduled for those who received their first dose of Pfizer between Feb. 12 and Feb. 20 at Shasta College or Vibra, and you can find details at www.ShastaReady.org. - Hours have been changed at two of Shasta County's COVID-19 state testing sites. The Senior Center at 2290 Benton Drive in Redding is now open from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday, and the Boggs Building at 2420 Breslauer Way in Redding is now open from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday. The hours at the state testing site at Shasta College are still 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday. Tests are free and appointments can be scheduled online at lhi.care/covidtesting. Walk-ins are also welcome.
