



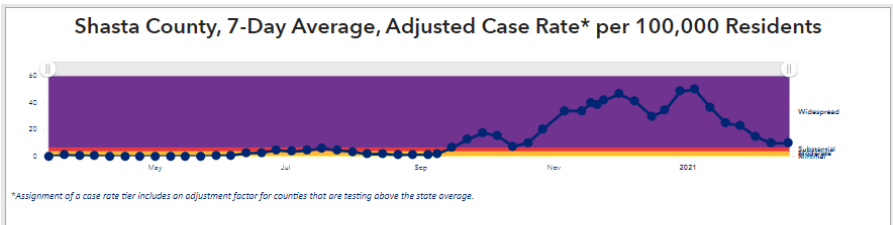

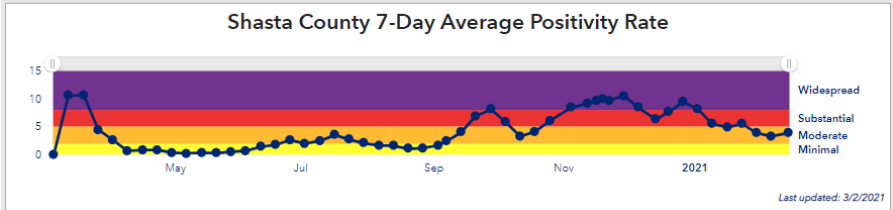

### CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 28 cases Sunday and Monday, including 13 men and 15 women:
  - 3 teenagers
  - 6 people in their 20s
  - 4 people in their 30s
  - 7 people in their 40s
  - 2 people in their 50s
  - 2 people in their 60s
  - 2 people in their 70s
  - 2 people over age 89



- We are sorry to have to report five deaths today. They are a woman in her 70s, a man in his 70s, two women in their 80s and a woman over age 89.



- SECOND DOSE CLINIC:** If you received your first dose of Moderna at Shasta College on Feb. 5 or 6 (or earlier), please come to a second-dose clinic on Friday, March 5 or Saturday, March 6, at Shasta College. Other second dose clinics have been scheduled for those who received their first dose of Pfizer between Feb. 12 and Feb. 20 at Shasta College or Vibra, and you can find details at [www.ShastaReady.org](http://www.ShastaReady.org). Select "Vaccinations" for more information.
- Shasta County remains in the red tier. Our adjusted case rate remained at 10.0 daily cases per 100,000 residents. The unadjusted case rate is 9.8, but the rate was adjusted up because our average testing volume is lower than the state average. Our positivity rate increased from 3.3% to 3.9%.
