### CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 22 cases Friday and Saturday, including 5 men and 17 women:
  - 3 children under 13
  - 2 teenagers
  - 5 people in their 20s
  - 4 people in their 30s
  - 2 people in their 40s
  - 2 people in their 50s
  - 1 person in their 60s
  - 1 person in their 70s
  - 1 person in their 80s
  - 1 person over age 89
- We are sorry to have to report two deaths today. They are a man in his 60s and a woman over the age of 89.
- Updates have been made to the COVID-19 Vaccine Eligibility Guidelines, which prioritizes vaccines for individuals based on age, occupation and medical background. The largest change allows health care providers to vaccinate individuals between 16 and 64 years old who are high-risk based on other medical conditions.
