CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 28 cases Wednesday, including 13 men and 15 women:
 - 3 children under age 13
 - 3 teenagers
 - 6 people in their 20s
 - 4 people in their 30s
 - 1 person in their 40s
 - 2 people in their 50s
 - 2 people in their 60s
 - 3 people in their 70s
 - 2 people in their 80s
 - 2 people over age 89
- Healthy people age 50 and older are now eligible to receive vaccine. To make an appointment, please go to <u>www.ShastaReady.org</u> and click on "Vaccinations." Many appointments are available in many locations.
- Question: How does the COVID vaccine work? Answer: The Pfizer and Moderna vaccines use messenger RNA (mRNA), while the Janssen vaccine by Johnson & Johnson uses viral vector technology. In both cases, the vaccines teach cells in our body to make the harmless protein spike found on the outside of the virus that causes COVID-19. The harmless protein spikes make our immune system think we've been infected, producing an immune response that creates antibodies. If a person is exposed to the virus that causes COVID in the future, the antibodies will recognize and attack the virus, preventing infection. All three brands are safe and effective.
