CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 64 cases Friday and Saturday, including 31 men, 32 women and 1 person of unknown gender:
 - 6 children under age 13
 - 6 teenagers
 - 5 people in their 20s
 - 14 people in their 30s
 - 9 people in their 40s
 - 7 people in their 50s
 - 6 people in their 60s
 - 6 people in their 70s
 - 5 people in their 80s
- **Vaccine availability expands:** All Shasta County residents age 16 and older are eligible for vaccine now. The Pfizer vaccine is the only brand that is approved for use for ages 16-17, and a parent must be present when their child is vaccinated. Numerous clinics are available, and some include weekend or evening hours. Learn more at www.ShastaReady.org; click on "Vaccinations."
- A Pfizer mass vaccination clinic is planned Friday at Shasta College. Vaccine is free. Sign up at www.myturn.ca.gov.
- Starting April 15, guidance for private events, live performances and informal gatherings will change. Shasta County is in the red tier, and if we remain there, this will mean:
 - **Private events:** Allowed outdoors with a maximum of 50 people, or 200 if all guests are tested or show proof of full vaccination. Allowed indoors with a maximum of 100 people if all guests are tested or show proof of full vaccination.
 - **Indoor seated live events and performances:** In-state visitors only with a weekly worker testing program, all tickets purchased in advance and delivered digitally. Venues that hold up to 1,500 people can have a maximum capacity of 10% or 100 people, or 25% capacity if all guests are tested or show proof of vaccination. Venues that hold 1,501 people or more can be at 20% capacity if all guests are tested or show proof of vaccination.
 - **Informal social gatherings:** Outdoors, maximum of 25 people. Indoor gatherings strongly discouraged, but with a maximum of 25% capacity where capacity limits exist, and up to 3 households or 10 people.
