### CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 30 cases Friday and Saturday, including 12 men and 18 women:
  - 1 child under age 13
  - 2 teenagers
  - 7 people in their 20s
  - 2 people in their 30s
  - 3 people in their 40s
  - 6 people in their 50s
  - 5 people in their 60s
  - 3 people in their 80s
  - 1 person over age 89
- We are sorry to report a death today. He was a man in his 70s.
- If you received your first dose of Pfizer vaccine at Shasta College on March 26, please come to Shasta College this Friday, April 16, for your second dose. Please come at the same time you got your first dose and bring your CDC vaccination card.
