CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 53 cases Tuesday, including 20 men, 32 women and 1 person of unknown gender:
 - 2 children under age 13
 - 6 teenagers
 - 12 people in their 20s
 - 5 people in their 30s
 - 9 people in their 40s
 - 3 people in their 50s
 - 4 people in their 60s
 - 4 people in their 70s
 - 5 people in their 80s
 - 3 people over age 89
- We are sorry to report two deaths today. They were two men in their 70s.
- This report includes a weekly update to our total case numbers, as we have been conducting case investigations to correct reported cases that were duplicates or out-of-county records.
- Friday's Pfizer vaccine clinic at Shasta College has been opened up to first doses. It is hosted by Dignity Health and Shasta County Public Health, and appointments are available from 7:45 until 3:30 p.m. Now that more pharmacies and other providers have COVID-19 vaccine available, this will be one of the county's last "mega clinics." This clinic offers an efficient way to get your vaccine quickly. Sign up at myturn.ca.gov. Because this is a Pfizer clinic, it is open to ages 16 and older. If you are under 18, a parent must be present. This is also a second-dose clinic for those who got their first dose at Shasta College on March 26; bring your CDC card.
- If you have symptoms of COVID-19 or have been exposed to someone who has COVID, please get tested. Testing is free, quick and easy. Walk-ins are available from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. weekdays at Shasta College, from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday at 2420 Breslauer Way, and from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Thursday through Saturday at the Senior Center at 2290 Benton Drive. - Fortunately, our COVID-19 case rate went down this week in Shasta County, but people are still getting sick. If you are ill, or if you have been around someone who is ill or has tested positive for COVID, please stay away from other people. COVID is a highly contagious disease.
