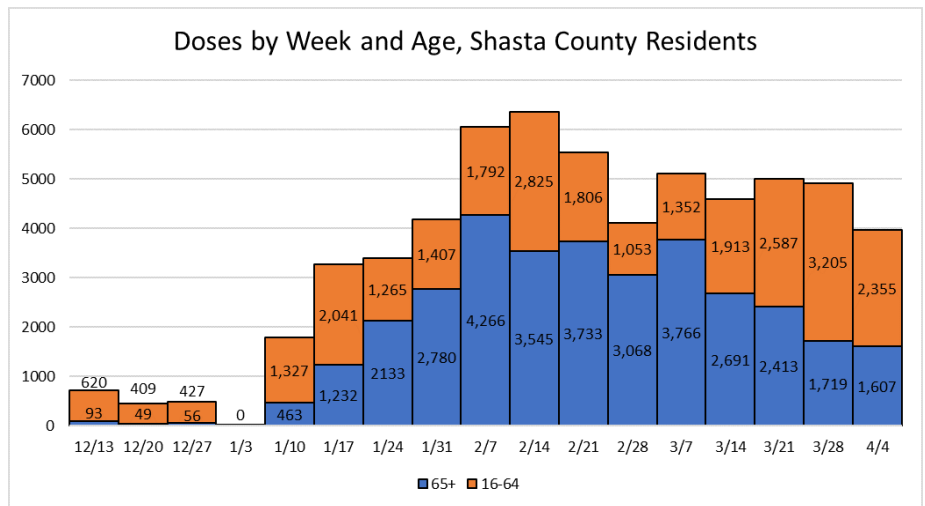

CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 24 cases Wednesday, including 12 men, 11 women and 1 person of unknown age and gender:

- 1 teenager
- 2 people in their 20s
- 5 people in their 30s
- 3 people in their 40s
- 3 people in their 50s
- 4 people in their 60s
- 1 person in their 70s
- 2 people in their 80s
- 2 people over age 89

- About 60,000 vaccine doses have been given to Shasta County residents, and 41,764 people (29% of people age 16+) have received at least one dose of vaccine. Of those, 23,532



(16% of people age 16+) have been fully vaccinated. About 35% of Shasta County residents age 65 and older are fully vaccinated, compared with 62% nationwide.
