



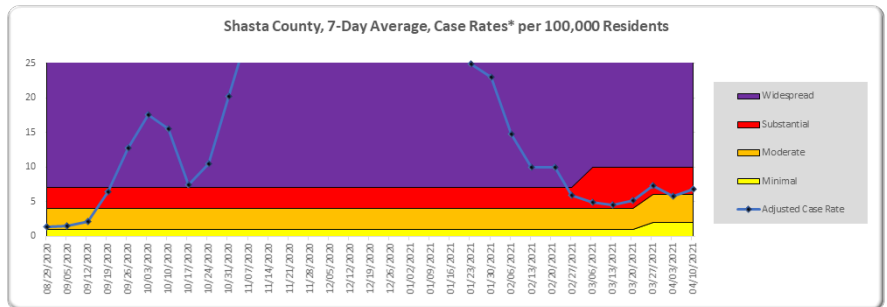
COVID-19 INCIDENT UPDATE: April 20, 2021

CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 25 cases Sunday and Monday, including 14 men and 11 women:
 - 3 children under age 13
 - 4 people in their 20s
 - 6 people in their 30s
 - 2 people in their 40s
 - 3 people in their 50s
 - 5 people in their 60s
 - 1 person in their 70s
 - 1 person of unknown age



- We are sorry to report a death today. He was a man in his 70s.
- Shasta County remains in the red (“substantial”) tier due to an increase in cases. Our adjusted case rate increased from 5.8 to 6.8 daily cases per 100,000 residents, and our positivity rate increased from 2.4% to 3.1%. Our case rate needs to be below 6.0 for two weeks in a row to move to the orange tier.
- Select Shasta County households have the opportunity to participate in a California Department of Public Health and Stanford University study to learn more about COVID-19 antibodies in California. Households from seven counties were randomly selected to participate, which involves an anonymous survey and free antibody test. Mailed invitations will be sent to more than 45,000 households statewide. Participating counties are Alameda, El Dorado, Kern, Los Angeles, Monterey, San Diego and Shasta.
