



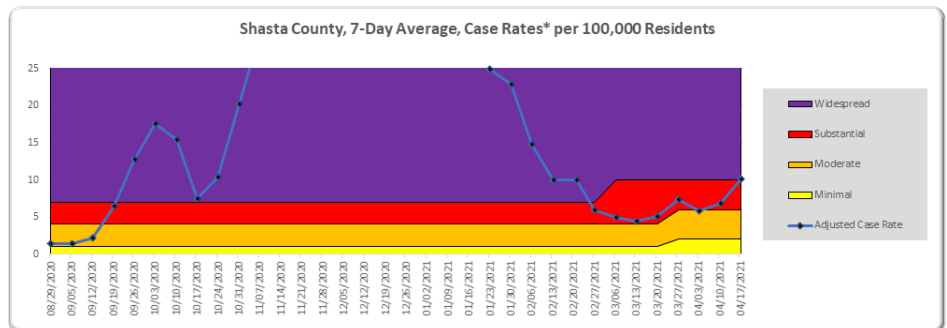
COVID-19 INCIDENT UPDATE: April 27, 2021

CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 36 cases Sunday and Monday, including 20 men, 15 women and 1 person of unknown gender:
 - 2 teenagers
 - 10 people in their 20s
 - 7 people in their 30s
 - 6 people in their 40s
 - 2 people in their 50s
 - 6 people in their 60s
 - 2 people in their 80s
 - 1 person over age 89



- Shasta County remains in the red (“substantial”) tier due to another increase in cases. Our adjusted case rate increased from 6.8 to 10.2 daily cases per 100,000 residents, and our positivity rate increased from 3.1% to 3.9%. Our case rate is now measuring in the purple tier, but the positivity rate is still in the orange tier, so we are not at risk of moving to the purple tier next week.
- Select Shasta County households have the opportunity to participate in a California Department of Public Health and Stanford University study to learn more about COVID-19 antibodies in California. Households from seven counties were randomly selected to participate, which involves an anonymous survey and free antibody test. Mailed invitations will be sent to more than 45,000 households statewide. Participating counties are Alameda, El Dorado, Kern, Los Angeles, Monterey, San Diego and Shasta.
