### CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 55 cases Wednesday, including 22 men and 33 women:
  - 3 children under age 13
  - 4 teenagers
  - 13 people in their 20s
  - 16 people in their 30s
  - 10 people in their 40s
  - 7 people in their 60s
  - 1 person in their 80s
  - 1 person over age 89
- We are sorry to report a death today. He was a man in his 60s.
- Shasta County has the state's **9<sup>th</sup> highest COVID-19 case rate** among counties with a population over 100,000, and the **8<sup>th</sup> lowest vaccination rate**. Many of our neighboring counties have reduced their case rates and moved to less restrictive tiers in the Blueprint for a Safer Economy, while Shasta has remained stuck in the red tier for 10 weeks. Most counties with higher vaccination rates have lower case rates, which means fewer people will get seriously ill or die. Please get vaccinated, wear your mask in public indoor spaces, keep your distance and stay home when sick until more of our population is protected. It's a simple formula that works.
