



## COVID-19 INCIDENT UPDATE: May 14, 2021

### CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 23 cases Thursday, including 8 men and 15 women:
  - 1 teenager
  - 7 people in their 20s
  - 7 people in their 30s
  - 4 people in their 40s
  - 3 people in their 50s
  - 1 person in their 60s
- All Shasta County residents age 12 and older are now eligible to receive COVID-19 vaccine. Ages 12-17 can only receive Pfizer, which was found to be safe and effective in protecting children as young as 12 in clinical trials. The COVID-19 vaccine is free for everyone, regardless of insurance or immigration status. - Reminder: The Johnson & Johnson and Moderna vaccines for ages 18 and up will be available at a clinic Saturday, May 15, in Happy Valley. If you wish to be vaccinated, you can sign up at [myturn.ca.gov](http://myturn.ca.gov), or you can drop by Happy Valley Elementary School, 17480 Palm Ave. in Anderson, between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. Saturday.

- **Don't ditch that mask quite yet!** The CDC has announced that fully vaccinated people can stop wearing masks in most places, but the new guidelines have not yet taken effect in California. The state's mask mandate has not yet been updated to reflect this change.
- Community events are resuming and things are opening up, but the virus is still here, so please continue to take precautions. Among California counties with populations higher than 100,000, Shasta County has the fourth-highest COVID-19 case rate and the third-lowest percentage of fully vaccinated residents.
